### Memorable Moments

To celebrate our 20 years of serving others, stories will be shared with you from our founder Karen Mesler. In 2008, Easter baskets were scheduled to be delivered to the temporary residents of the Karen Catholic Worker House located in North St. Louis. A home for women and children to stay while recovering from assorted hardships and nowhere else to go. Before our founder traveled from St. Peters to St. Louis she picked up a donation of Easter bunnies, one was very large! Too large to fit in any Easter basket but she took it with the hope it could provide joy to someone. The Big Bunny rode in the passenger side of the pick up truck, for fun, and the baskets were in the bed of the truck with some food donations for the residents and volunteers of the Karen House. As our founder arrived in the unforgiving parking lot, there was a young mom with her little girl, guessing around 18 to 24 months old, carefully walking across the parking lot to 'come home'. One could only imagine the trauma that brought the mom and little one to the Karen Catholic Worker House. When our founder parked the truck and came around the vehicle to start unloading the Easter baskets and food, the little girl waved, bringing a big smile on our founder's face. Such joy from a little one, unaware of life's circumstances. It was at that moment our founder asked the mom if it would be permissible for her little one to have the large stuffed bunny. The mom happily agreed. Our founder opened the passenger door for the mom to reach in and give the bunny to her daughter. In 2008, the mission of Alleluia Baskets was to help children smile on Easter. There were many smiles that day!!
